Path To Shine – Macon continues to provide a nurturing, energetic tutoring program for fifteen 1st-3rd graders from Bruce Elementary School. Students have focused on reading, learning and understanding sight words, and writing sentences. We have received donations of hundreds of books from tutors, the community & Path To Shine in Atlanta. We have also introduced the children to Brain Gym activities which allow the children to experience kinesthetic learning activities.



Southside Community Church, where we hold the program each week, was blessed with the gift of a new playground, complete with state-of-the-art equipment, thanks to a partnership with the 2011 Leadership Macon class and Habitat for Humanity. And thanks to the Canterbury Club at Mercer University, we have our first student tutor. We are working with other local colleges for additional tutors. We also have two high school soccer athletes who instruct the children in correct soccer techniques, - a very popular activity! Tutors and our partners are blessed to offer this ministry to our little brothers and sisters.
