

School Discipline At the Statewide Summit for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), Dr. John D. Barge, State School Supt. opened the confer-

ence with some powerful findings: When PBIS was implemented in Bartow County, the first school in which it was tried cut discipline referrals in half in the first year. In the next year, that same school went from worst to first in the county in reading. These findings support the work done by our Board Chair, Robert Rhodes Esq., Director of Projects for the Georgia Appleseed Center for Law & Justice, a non-profit organization.
