

Giselle was identified by school counselors as a student who needed some special attention. It wasn't because she had any academic problems her grades were actually just fine. "Painfully shy" described her because it really did seem to cause her pain to be around other people. She would not socialize with her fellow students, nor join in group activities and her head always seemed to be down. Something had caused

her pain which made cocooning herself from others less stressful. Giselle found a mentor, Mr. Bill, who helped pull her out of the protective shell in which she had wrapped herself. He was the perfect person to work with Giselle, content to simply sit quietly with her, waiting. He allowed her the space to be who she was, uniquely Giselle, a child of God. Giselle started to respond, and as she left the school building each week and walked up the hill with her fellow students, Giselle looked for Mr. Bill. When she saw him, she would break into a wide smile, answer-



ing the bright smile which Mr. Bill offered to her. Eventually she was able to join the other children in Path To Shine in their group activities, and her teacher and the school social worker reported that she was interacting and joining with her classmates. Her self-isolation was starting to end, and her trust in other people was gradually being restored, thanks in large measure to her time with Mr. Bill.

Learning to Listen



Anthony is a kindergartener in the Morrow program. Being a part of the program has helped Anthony grow socially as well as academically. To begin with, Anthony wasn't excited about doing his homework, listening, or following directions. Now he listens to stories, gets on with his homework, and does what he is asked to do. Anthony has been given a lot of encouragement from all of the teachers in our program, and he has blossomed in every way.


Share the Love with \$29 & 5 Friends
